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The second form is a "CHURCH RECORD," with spaces for baptisms, confirmations, ordinations, endowments, and patriarchal blessings and various particulars of the same.

The third form is a "SEALING RECORD," with spaces for name of person sealed, birth date, time, place, etc.

The fourth form is a "BAPTISM FOR THE DEAD RECORD," with spaces for names, dates, birth death, baptism, confirmation, etc.

EASTERN

Text of the Times and States.

WASHINGTON, 21.—The following is the full text of the bill introduced in the Senate by Charles, and now before the public lands Committee: That all citizens of the United States, and other persons bona fide residents of the State of Colorado or Nevada, or either of the Territories of New Mexico, Arizona, Utah, Wyoming, Dakota, Idaho, Washington, or Montana, shall be and are hereby authorized and permitted to fell and remove for building, agricultural, mining, or other domestic purposes, any timber or other trees growing or being on the public lands; said lands being mineral and not subject to entry under the existing laws of the United States in either of said States or Territories, of which such citizens or persons may be at the time bona fide residents, and that section 2,462 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and all other acts and parts of acts prohibiting the felling or removing of timber or trees growing on the public lands of the United States, or providing penalties therefor, so far as they conflict with this act, are hereby repealed.

Cause of the Rise in Silver.

The director of the mint is in receipt of information that the recent rise in the price of silver is due to the famine in certain districts of India, for which large quantities of rice were procured directly from Siam, and silver sent from London, where the general government freely supplied it. A treatise on money and legal tenders in the United States, by Dr. Linderman, director of the mint, will be issued by a New York publishing house in a few days.

FOREIGN.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Eastern War News.

LONDON, 21.—A Russian official dispatch from Gurny Studen, reports that in one of their assaults on Friday, the Romanians entered and occupied the second Gritva redoubt before the Turks, but during the evening the redoubt was recaptured by the Turks.

A telegram, dated Foredin, Saturday, says that the Romanians captured the redoubt on Friday, after three vigorous assaults, but during the night, the Turks, collecting all their forces, re-occupied it after a most sanguinary contest. It was expected that fighting would continue on Saturday.

A Russian official account gives the Romanian loss on Friday at five officers and 183 men. Bulgarian Pasha telegraphs that the Russians have incorporated 18,000 Bulgarians into their army, and that he expects to be attacked. He has strengthened himself so as to cover Ruscuk.

Arif Pasha, the new Turkish ambassador to Paris, is instructed to state, immediately on his arrival, on which day he will make peace if the powers wish to mediate.

In consequence of Mukhtar Pasha's disaster, all the troops in Constantinople have been sent hastily to Teshin.

Abdinet Eyyub Pasha will immediately take command at Erzerum.

Suleiman Pasha is about to send Col. Valentine Baker and other English officers back to Constantinople.

A dispatch dated Karajoi, Wednesday, says Gen. Heyman is advancing on Erzerum. Kara is surrounded, and negotiations for its surrender have been opened.

The Russian headquarters are now at Yezinkoi.

Gen. Lazareff is marching against Ismail Pasha.

A Bucharest dispatch says a general formation in the American army, and now correspondent of the New York Times, has been expelled from Roumania by the Russian authorities because he served in the Turkish army during the Crimean war.

The position at Soenik and Kadikoi are retained for the present by the Turks. It seems evident, however, that a retrograde movement has commenced.

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
