

A DRY SEPTEMBER.

Less Precipitation in Our Locality Than Ever Before, as Far as Known.

The United States department of agriculture and weather bureau says in its monthly review of Utah weather for September, 1902:

Temperature. — The month would be properly characterized as a very dry one, and one above the average September in warmth. The atmospheric movement was sluggish, resulting in absence of storms and a prevailing dryness.

The amount of sunshine was unusual, even for September. The total amount of sunshine at Salt Lake City, for the month, was 235 hours, or about 90 per cent of the possible amount.

There were two hot spells, one from the 11th to the 13th, and the other from the 18th to the 20th. During the latter period the temperature was 90° at Salt Lake City, and 92° at Ogden.

INTERESTING CONFERENCE.

Of the Weber Stake, Held at Ogden, Oct. 16th and 17th, 1902.

Editor Desert News:

This evening closed two days of the most interesting conference meetings that have been held in the Weber Stake for a number of years past.

The conference commenced on Sunday morning, and although the notice was brief and the weather inclement, by shortly after ten o'clock the tabernacle in this city was filled to its utmost capacity with people from all parts of the county, all anxious to hear instruction from those who have a right to "speak as men having authority."

After the opening exercises President C. F. Middleton, on behalf of the Stake presidency, reported the condition of the Weber Stake, as such. He said the presidency were united in all their operations and administration among the people, they were harmoniously together and there was not a jar between them in anything. He also said the High Council were strongly united as a council, and worked in harmony with the presidency in the labors to promote the interests of the work of that and the welfare of the Stake in this city.

He likewise spoke in terms of commendation and appreciation of the labors of the several wards. He represented the Stake in the Stake generally as being in a good condition. The Relief Society, Associations and Sabbath Schools were prosperous and doing excellent work in their several spheres.

The Bishop who reported the condition of the wards confirmed in a decisive manner the statement of President Middleton.

The speakers at these meetings were President L. Snow, Apostle F. D. Richards, A. H. Cannon and President Joseph H. Young of the First Council of the Seventies, and L. W. Burdett of this Stake, who held the attention of the audience riveted upon their utterances.

The chief topics dealt upon were the completion of the Salt Lake Temple and the important speech it forms in the history of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
