Legislature Candidates Nominated Under Wild Applause.

CURRENT A POINT IN DISPUTE.

A Mob Attacks a Party of Government supporters and Readers Them Like a Book.

Mr. JONES, May 12.—The organization of legislative candidates in the Bay District took place at Davis' home yesterday evening from the main entrance of the residence. Messrs. Atwater, Ayer and McPherson paid their less to gold, while the Whitewater candidates paid their in bank notes. The government candidates urged a protest against the acceptance of the notes on the ground that they were not legal tender. The Whitewater candidates, however, adopted, and they could speak themselves on a point with the members less to gold.
