G. S. L. CITY, Thursday, Jan. 3, 1856.
6 1-2 p.m.

Convened in the Typographical Hall, Council House.
Counselor J. McKnight in the chair.

Opened with prayer by Elder J. V. Long.
A communication addressed to the Association was received from Pres't. P. H. Young, dated "Fillmore City, Dec. 30, 1855," of which the following is an extract:—
"As a legislative body, I am happy to say, with but one or two exceptions we are enjoying good health; and all seem engaged in representing the wishes of their constituents, and in promoting the general good.

You will meet on Thursday next, to consult upon measures for the benefit of our craft, and the common weal;—my prayer is, that your labors may be attended with success. I would here make one suggestion: that as a body, you pray earnestly to God, to pour upon his servant Brigham the Spirit of prophecy and revelation, that he may show unto us, those things that are shortly to take place; for the Spirit signifieth that great events speedily await this people, as also the inhabitants of the whole earth.

My mind is very much occupied with these things; and O, if I could be with you, how zealously I would impress them upon your minds."

The report of committee on By-Laws, &c., was received adopted, and com. discharged.

By nomination, Dr. Levi Richards, Elders John Lyon, W. G. Mills and Jno. T. Hardy were chosen Hon. Members of this Association.

On motion, J. McKnight, J. S. Davis, and E. Allen were appointed a com. to revise the Constitution.

Adjourned to one week from this evening.
