PLANTING LAKE TROUT.

State Fish and Game Warden Sharp was in Provo yesterday for the purpose of planting 250,000 eastern lake trout. They were placed in Dry creek, a tributary of Utah lake, that stream being selected by County Warden Jones, and approved by Mr. Sharp as the best place for the purpose. The purpose of the young trout will remain there till about fall when they will work into the lake. This variety of trout reaches an immense size, some having been known to attain a weight of 70 pounds, and they will therefore be a valuable addition to the large family of the finny tribe already domiciled in Utah lake. Messrs. Sharp and Jones also visited Provo canyon where they witnessed a sight calculated to stir the blood of the sportsman—the shooting of the dam at the Provo plant by the trout ascending the stream to spawn. Mr. Sharp was delighted to see such a large migration, and Mr. L. Donnan, an angler, was also present. The trout company is putting in a line from Provo to the crushing station on the Bunnell farm northwest of the city.
