

—Voting by Electricity.—A fresh application of electricity has just been made in an apparatus for voting presented to the parliament of Vienna. Each of the deputies has before him, at his seat in the chamber, two knobs, one white and the other black, and the vote is given by pressing one of them. Two frames are placed by the side of the president, on one of which the affirmative vote appears as white points on a black ground, and the negative on the other, in black spots on a white ground. Each pressure of the deputy's hand on the knobs is marked by electricity on one of the tablets, according to the vote he wishes to give.
