NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—A terrible accident that befell little Alice McQuarrie, the three-year-old daughter of President and Mrs. J. G. McQuarrie, has cast a gloom over the entire conference. Alice and her little playmate, Zana Lund, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Ray Lund, were playing Monday evening in an upstairs bedroom. Zana climbed up on a bureau to heat a comb to curl Alice's hair; the comb was made of celluloid, and instantly caught fire, dropping on Alice and burning her face, neck, ears, arms and hands most dreadfully. The screams of the children brought the parents from an adjoining room, and desperately they fought to save Alice from being burned to death. Dr. Lund was badly burned, and President McQuarrie and Elder Ford hardly less so. A doctor was summoned at once, and everything done to alleviate the sufferings of the child. It is nearly a week since the accident, and the attending physician is now filled with encouragement. Now that it is certain she will live, it is earnestly hoped she may escape serious disfigurement. Mrs. McQuarrie has never left her child's bedside, and the strain is telling on her greatly. But for the prompt efforts of Dr. Lund and President McQuarrie, both children must have perished, and a feeling of thankfulness is expressed by all that they have been saved from a horrible death.
