

BEHEL STIRS UP THE REICHSTAG. He Vigorously Dehounces the German Government's Foreign Policy. CREATED MUCH MERRIMENT.

Berlin, Dec. 7.—Herr Behel, the Socialist leader in the Reichstag, today attacked the government's foreign policy. He said the emperor's visit to Morocco was a provocation calculated to exercise the greatest distrust on the part of the other nations.

CONGRESS AND THE SMOOT CASE. Belief is that Present Session Will Determine Whether He Shall Remain. TARIFF AND RECIPROCIITY. No Reduction Probable Except With The Philippines—Two New States.

TARIFF AND RECIPROCIITY. There will probably be a great deal of talk about tariff changes, and in this connection reciprocity will be brought forward. It has already been agreed that there will be neither tariff changes nor reciprocity treaties adopted.

ISLANDS OF THE CARIBBEAN. Santa Domingo will figure largely in the first executive session of the senate. The policy of the president with regard to our supervision over the republics to the south of us is involved.

PHILIPPINE TARIFF REDUCTION. Unless the trip to the Philippines of senators and representatives taken last summer at the instigation of Smoot, Taft is a failure there will be a reduction if not an entire abolition of the duty on all goods coming to the United States from the Philippines.
