- JULY 21st 150-B.C.-Darius, Coadmonarch of Darius III, last of the original line of Persian kings, dying from the Persian the Great, was murdered. 1601-Pope Nicholas II died. 1796-Robert Burns, poet of Scotland, died at Dumfries, born near Ayr 1759. 1861-Battle of Bull Run, called by the Confederates the First Battle of Manassas, commanded by General Beauregard, numbering 22,000 men, and General J. B. Magruder of the Confederates, General Joseph E. Johnston, brought 5,000 troops from the Shenandoah to the support of Beauregard, giving the battle a decisive result. The battle ended in the precipitate retreat of McDowell's army. 1869-Rear Admiral Mirambach Smith, retired, died (born 1814). 1880-John G. Ingham, soldier, lawyer and noted abolitionist, died at Dubuque, Iowa; born 1824.
