City Tax Levy for 1907 Fixed at Seven Mills—A House of \$7,000 Figured On.

The City Council met in regular session last night, all of the members present except Olavson. President McCormick outlined the clear and business was transacted as follows:

The following ordinance was then passed during the meeting held in all legal respect:

An ordinance levying the tax on the assessed value of the taxable property within the corporate limits of Salt Lake City for the year 1907.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Territory of Utah, that there is hereby levied on all the real and personal estate or property within the corporate limits of the city of Salt Lake City, Territory of Utah, made taxable by the general laws of said Territory and said ordinance, the sum of seven mills on the dollar to defray the contingent expenses, the expense of conducting the meters, the expense of opening, improving and keeping in repair the streets and sidewalks and the expense of constructing and keeping in repair sewers and drains in said city.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval.


