

NORMAL SUNDAY SCHOOL.
The New Brigham Inaugurated Yesterday in Provo.

Dear Deseret News:

PROVO CITY, Nov. 14.—The Normal Sunday school, notice of the organization of which by the General Superintendent of the Sunday School Union, he already appeared in the News, was inaugurated today in the Brigham Young Academy.

The rooms were well warmed and heated by the superior warm-air system of heating, and everything was clean, commodious and comfortable.

The congregation, composed of children, normal students, Sunday school teachers, visitors, the members of the faculty, and Sunday school authorities, assembled in room 4, and at 10 o'clock were called to order by Superintendent Benjamin Cliff, Jr.

On the stand were Elders George Goldard and George Reynolds, of the General Board of the Deseret Sunday School Union; President A. O. Smith and Bishop J. N. Booth, of the State Board of Education, the members of the faculty, and a few prominent visitors.

Copies of the Sunday School Union song book had been distributed and the congregation sang "Beautiful Zion."

Eliza Reynolds opened with prayer, invoking the blessings of heaven upon this "new departure."

"But you think to pray," was then said, and Brother Cliff arose and gave the following outline of the work designed in this department of the school:

The school is divided into three grades, viz.—Primary, an Intermediate and a Higher. Over each grade there will be placed a teacher, and as many assistant chosen as may be necessary, the design being to give more than about ten pupils to one teacher. Normal students will be present at the reunions of the classes as observers of the methods of teaching, and those in their turns will be called upon to teach. (Here the normal present were divided into classes of observers for each grade.)

Each grade will have three sub-classes of classes as follows:

PRIMARY.

(a) Stories from the Bible with charts.
(b) Stories from Book of Mormon with charts.
(c) The Primary Leaflets.

INTERMEDIATE.

(a) Readings from the Old and New Testament.
(b) Reading from the Book of Mormon with illustrations.
(c) Study of Leaflets.

HIGHER.

(a) A Study of Principles as arranged in Compendium.
(b) Reading of Orion Pratt and similar works.
(c) Moral Instruction: Theory of Teaching adapted to Sunday School work.

Following are officers: Superintendent, R. Cliff Jr.; Assistant Superintendent, H. H. Brimley; Head Teachers, Sister M. H. Glines; Head Teachers, Higher Grade, N. L. Nelson; Intermediate Grade, Walter M. Wolfe; Primary Grade, Mrs. Amy Brown; Librarian, Edward Holt.

The school will be as follows:—
10:00-11:00 Lectures on Teaching.
11:00-12:00 Intermediate.
12:00-1:00 Opening exercises and administration of sacrament.

1:00-2:00 Classes exercise in the various subjects.

2:00-2:30 Cleaning exercises.
Brother Cliff announced that the mortal director would spend every Sunday ten minutes in each grade in teaching songs appropriate to the age of pupils, singing would be particularly encouraged.

The last remark pleased Capt. Glines, who now arose to address the meeting. He had been connected twenty-five years with Sunday school work. No person could better appreciate the value of any man or woman than that of teacher and especially teacher in a Sabbath school. Weighty results had been accomplished in that with inadequate facilities. What might we hope for in the future, not that he lived to live, but the organization of a school, especially for the training of Sunday school teachers. He congratulated that young people below him and asked God's blessing on this new movement.

Brother Young closed his remarks with the joy of being a Latter-day Saint, and no man did not fail to communicate happiness to others.

Brother Reynolds stated that this movement in the rural appalled and surprised all of the general authorities, and much would be expected from this school in systematizing and harmonizing the work throughout Zion.

President Simon declared that no greater moral feature had ever been or could be seen in the history of the B. Y. Academy. He insisted that the work had been begun, and promised all that his influence, if possible, would do to great good in Zion.

"Brother Edward has not told us?" said Elder John C. Johnson, President Brigham Young, wishing to begin an important home industry, called him from the position of leading merchant in this city, to the humiliating office of papering gatherer. He accepted the call, and did his best. If the office did not confer honor on him, he conferred honor on the office. God has since rewarded him sufficiently in the position he now holds. I often think that Brother Godard's experience is a parallel in the case of early Sunday school teachers as compared with the present or at least future teachers in this great cause. Twenty-five years ago it was hardly conceivable an hour to be a teacher in a school in a Sunday school. At that time it is not fully true today, it will be when our schools like the one opened here to day shall have had their full influence."

Superintendent M. H. Hardy, of the M. H. Academy, pledged the new movement to the highest power, and the commencement of all efforts to sustain this worthy sentiment.

The grades now went to the various rooms for class organization and informal instruction. On reassembling

many other good things were said, but enough has been reported to cover the general spirit, purpose and prospects of this new organization.

Selling the Diamonds to India.

In India diamonds are found scattered about in the ground, and are collected by Indians for diamonds have been found in sizes both in the upper and lower Mimbres rocks. These consist of a series of shales, limestone, sandstone, cut up and scattered with intrusions of trap. A species of conglomerate made up of what looks like tilted boulders, with scattered pebbles of various materials, quartz and sandstone is the matrix in which the diamonds are found.

When looking for the stones the weather, as in most weather, the temperature is of a very heavy color and very friable, so that it can readily break and the grains stand away, leaving the pebbles, which are of a white, red, brown and green color. A kind of granite yields about a quart of pebbles, and it from this a heavy weight of diamonds is recovered the mine is considered worth mining.

Owing to the classical concretionary rocks of these diamonds make it difficult to be determined whether the distinct diamond is not. In this district the surface is extremely hard and tough and of a greenish color. It requires months of exposure to the atmosphere and frequent splittings with water before the quartz becomes sufficiently brittle to obtain the pebbles without breaking them.

All attempts to extract the matrix without destroying the individual diamonds are fruitless, and the only way to determine the quality is to cut.
