
UTAH STAKE CONFERENCE.

The Quarterly Conference of Utah Stake was held in Provo Meetinghouse, Nov. 27 and 28, 1880.

After the usual devotional exercises,

President David John addressed the congregation on the necessity of the Saints being in earnest in carrying out the purposes of the gospel, and dwelt upon the predictions of Daniel relating to the establishment of the work of the latter-days.

Bishop Wm.
