CALL FOR PRIMARIES.

THE SABBATH DAY.

People of Canada Never Too Busy To Observe Strictly the Day of Rest.

PENALTY FOR ITS VIOLATION.

No Saloons Among the "Mormons"—Annual Celebration of "Squirrel Day."

Hon. Angus M. Cannon, while on his recent visit to the "Mormon" settlements in Canada, was much impressed with the general observance of the Sabbath day. One man, he says, who thought he had to work Sundays in order to accomplish that which he desired to, was followed a distance of 20 miles by the officers, and finally arrested and fined for his violation of the Sabbath day. This law is enforced throughout the Dominion, and the consequence is that there is a reverence felt for that day not common in other parts of the country.

The "Mormon" settlements have no fire departments, but in accordance with the custom of the country the constable dons a red coat which is a signal to all citizens to "go thou and do likewise" in case of fire. In this way damage by fire is reduced to a minimum, for every able-bodied man in the community is required by law to lay aside other duties and render whatever assistance is necessary in this direction.

"SQUIRREL DAY." Another thing which impressed President Cannon was the celebration of what is known as "Squirrel day." As is well known, certain sections of the Dominion are infested with "prairie dogs," and in order to aid in their extermination the government has set apart a certain day in the year for this purpose, and has provided a fund for the purchase of strychnine with which to kill them. This is scattered over the wheat and is sure death to all who partake of it. Thus thousands of the pest are killed every year.

While at Raymond President Cannon heard a notice read requiring the farmers to clear their fields of all weeds. If they did not do so government officers would do it for them at their expense. The visitor felt that the enforcement of such a law in this section would be a blessing.

NO SALOONS AMONG "MORMONS." President Cannon visited Sterling, Raymond and Magrath during his absence. These are typical "Mormon" settlements and no saloon is found in them. For the absence of the "Mormon" people have been highly commended by the government. Nor are drug stores allowed to sell liquor only the prescription of a physician, so that in this way this traffic is reduced to a minimum.

Before coming home President Cannon secured a handsome buffalo head, which he will present to the museum of the Latter-day Saints' university. He says he got it simply as a reminder of pioneer days in this valley, when buffaloes were as thick on the prairie as crows were on the ground. The head is that of a bison captured in the vicinity of the "Mormon" settlements, from which section "the monarch of the plains" disappeared some 20 or 30 years ago.

Canada, says President Cannon, has some magnificent coal beds, while her beet fields promise much in the production of sugar. An industry now fairly started in that section. While they have had quite a dry spell this season, crops generally are looking well and the people are much encouraged as a result.
