SUB-TREASURY SHORTAGE.

Chief of Secret Service Wilkie Takes Charge of Investigation.

St. Louis, Oct. 18 .- Chief Wilkle of the U. S. secret service today, took charge of the investigation into the alleged shortage of \$61,200 in the funds of the St. Louis sub-treasury. He summoned D. P. Dyer, Jr., the receiving teller, and held a secret con-ference for some time. Gideon -W. Bantz, the assistant sub-treasurer, who

is credited with having discovered and reported the alleged discrepancy was later called into the conference. When Chief Wilkle inally reappeared and was asked if there were any develop-ments in the case, he replied that he was "just waiting" and had no state-ment to make at this time.

Sub-Treasurer Thomas J. Akins de-clines to discuss the alleged shortage, He said that it would probably occupy about two weeks in counting the funds in the sub-treasury and in making a thorough investigation of ac-counts and not until then would it be ascertained whether a clerical error had been made or whether there is an actual shortage,
