

PRESIDENT TAFT'S PHILIPPINE POLICY

Senator Stone Takes Issue With
It, Favoring Granting of In-
dependence to Islands.

THAT IS FILIPINOS' PRAYER.

It is to be regarded as American Terri-
tory in Union and Should
Have Free Trade.

Washington, D. C., April 20.—Taking issue squarely with President Taft on the latter's Philippine policy, Senator Stone of Missouri, in a carefully prepared speech delivered in the senate today on the subject of the tariff, urged the withdrawal of the United States from the islands within a period of fifteen years, pending which the people of those islands should enjoy all the benefits of a legitimate free trade with this country.

STONE'S PROPOSITIONS.

In the form of an amendment, Mr. Stone proposed to strike out section 1 of the Philippine tariff bill, and to substitute therefor a provision declaring it to be the policy of the United States to grant independence to the islands whenever they have attained a stable government capable of maintaining public order; to negotiate agreements with other powers to insure the islands' independence by neutralizing them; to admit free of duty into the United States, until this policy has been fulfilled, all articles wholly the growth and product of the island; in consideration of which agricultural implements and machinery, cotton and cotton manufactures, books and publications, and machinery for use in manufactures of all kinds, "wholly the growth and product of the United States," should be admitted free into the islands. An important feature of the provision is that it would not become operative until it had first been approved by the existing legislative authority of the Philippine government.

PRAYER OF FILIPINOS.

"The one long prayer of the Philippine people is for independence," declared Mr. Stone, "and if Congress should make such a declaration as I have indicated, it would serve as an inspiration to them to strive after progress to the utmost limit of their capacity. The tariff feature of the amendment would be in the nature of a reciprocal trade relation established by agreement." He asserted his belief that during the proposed fifteen-year period there would be no dangerous increase of Philippine importations, and that on the other hand, with free entry into the Philippines of the articles named our exports would exceed our imports, and the islands being of some necessity to the Philippines.

In its present form the tariff bill admits to free trade between the islands and the United States articles produced in the two countries, but places certain restrictions upon importations to the United States of sugar, tobacco and cigars. Senator Stone contended that if the islands are to be treated as American territory, and that if it is our duty to hold them permanently under our absolute sovereignty, then, as he construed the Constitution, the products of the islands have a right to enter all American

Referring to the proposal to subject to the ordinary duty on like articles from other foreign countries importations of the restricted articles in excess of the amount provided, Mr. Stone said that "if the islands are American territory, then Congress, in my opinion, is without constitutional authority to lay duties on their products by levying tariffs upon them."

ARE ISLANDS TERRITORY?
But, Mr. Stone argued, he did not believe the Philippines were a territory of the United States and for Congress to lay duties on their products would be an act of bad faith.

Unrestricted free trade with the islands was not approved by Mr. Stone under existing conditions. He voiced the fear that to encourage American investment in Philippine industrial enterprises might bring future complications that would hinder or embarrass the final execution of our national policy.

He also opposed the granting of free trade relations without a declaration of independence to the islands. He said that the islands are a foreign country, and that the United States has no right to grant them free trade relations without a declaration of independence.

While not opposing the section in question, Mr. Stone admitted that he had been much impressed by the contention that the free importation of sugar and tobacco from the Philippines would be disastrous to the growers of tobacco and sugar in this country, without a corresponding benefit to the consumer. He admitted that free trade might so alarm those interested in the development of the growing sugar industry in this country as to check its expansion. Furthermore he questioned the wisdom of encouraging the investment of American capital to build up industries of a foreign country to the detriment of our own.

CASE SUMMARIZED.
Summarizing his reasons for not supporting the section of the bill as it stands, Mr. Stone said he could not do so because:

"First, if the islands are to be regarded as an American territory, then they are within the Union, and their products should have free access to all our ports without restriction or limitation."

"Second, if our occupation of the islands is intended to be only temporary, and if it is our policy to surrender them to their own people, then we should pass no law which would tend to create such commercial or political conditions between the islands and this country as might delay or embarrass the final completion of our purposes; and

"Third, we are under no such obligation to the Philippine people as to make it our duty to support their government within the Union, and their products should have free access to all our ports without restriction or limitation."

"I prefer to stand squarely upon the Democratic platform and do for the Philippines what the United States and for Congress to lay duties on their products would be an act of bad faith."

HAARLEM OIL CAPSULES CENSUS BILL

Senator McCumber Charged
Census Office Place of Refuge
for Favored Ones.

THE LAW OF APPORTIONMENT

Gallinger Assured it is a Mere Farce
In Its Application—Bailey Termed
Civil Service Law a "Humbug."

Washington, April 20.—The census bill today was sent back to conference by the senate in order that its amendments relating to the civil service law and requiring the construction of a building for the census work in this city might be further considered.

At 4:20 o'clock p. m. in the senate adjourned.

That the census office has in its employ in one bureau the wife of a secretary of a member of Congress, the wives of two officials of the war department and the wife of a prominent official in the treasury department, was the charge made today by Senator McCumber in criticizing the conference report on the census bill.

"Through the bill," he said, "seems to be almost wholly for women who have husbands in the departments. This is getting to be a city of official families holding positions under the government."

Mr. McCumber said the census bill as agreed to by the conferees did not differ materially from the measure which was voted in the last Congress by President Roosevelt, who claimed that it contravened the spirit of the civil service law. By the operation of the law according to the provisions of the census bill as agreed to by the conferees, he said, employees of the government are not apportioned among the several states. The fact, he said, is that whole families are employed in government departments credited to states which the younger members of families have never seen. Mr. McCumber argued the necessity of his amendment requiring actual residence by the applicant from a state, which was stricken out by the conferees.

Senator Gallinger said it was notorious that whole families are employed in the government service in this city and that the law of apportionment is a mere farce in its application.

Senator Lodge supported Mr. McCumber's amendment, and said it was notorious that there was a grave abuse in the law apportioning the employees of the government among the several states.

"Tardy and false certificates are given by applicants for the government service," said Senator Carter. "The civil service commission seems to me to be accountable to the country and to Congress for permitting this condition to exist."

Defending the conference report, Senator La Follette expressed the opinion that the inequality of apportionment of civil service employees was exaggerated, and said that, whatever the fault might be, Congress was to blame. Advocating a limited tenure of service of 10 years, the departmental service in this city, Senator Hayburn said:

"While I have great respect for gray hairs, yet if you look down the aisles in some of your departments you will see a snow drift in respect to age, respectability and former competency."

He hoped some day, he said, to have the civil service question squarely before the senate for consideration.

Senators Hale and Bailey took the view that the course of the senate in seeking to amend the census bill by changing a general law in relation to all apportionment placed the bill at a disadvantage in its dispute with the house of representatives. Mr. Bailey denounced the civil service law as a "hum and a humbug," and declared the debate had shown that the "just and perfect law" had operated to cheat communities as well as individuals.

Mr. Bailey said it was not a kindness to any young man to bring him to this city to work for the government.

The agreement by conferees to strike out the proposition contained in the senate amendment to construct a building to house the census employees was also subjected to criticism. Senators Newlands, Money and Bacon claiming that the old building which it was proposed to purchase and occupy was unsanitary in location and unfit for use.

An aye and nay vote on the conference report resulted in its rejection by a vote of 25 to 45, and a further conference was ordered.
