SPECIAL SESSION OF CAL. LEGISLATURE.

Sacramento, Cal., Nov. 19.—The special session of the legislature called by Gov. Gillett convened today. The governor's message, which was read in both houses, says that the session has been convened to enact legislation believed to be imperative because of the financial stringency brought about by conditions existing in the east.

The banking laws need to be amended so as to afford better protection to depositors. Trust companies and corporations doing an interest-bearing business should be placed under federal laws, and if necessary the constitution should be amended to increase the methods of doing banking business in this state. Owing to conditions in the east our bankers are unable to secure the balance of their funds with the withdrawal of money from the banks and the hoarding of it has depleted the cash reserve.

MRS. BRADLEY'S TESTIMONY

Washington, Nov. 19.—"I am so tired," said Mrs. Anna M. Bradley, the defendant in the trial now in progress in the criminal court in this city a few minutes before 2 o'clock today, after she had spent about four hours on the witness stand relating the details of her acquaintance and intimacy with former United States Senator Brown, with whose murder she stands accused. Judge Stafford immediately gave orders for the adjournment of the court to the next day.

Relating the particulars of a second arrest in Salt Lake in 1902, Mrs. Bradley said that she had vehemently protested the efforts of a third party to make a financial arrangement with her.

Bradley told of the senator's presenting her with a revolver in Pocatello in 1902. "He told me," she said in a mere whisper, "that he had bought it for me to protect myself with from Mrs. Brown." After that time Mrs. Bradley said she carried the weapon in a handbag. She told of an encounter in the hotel at Pocatello with Mrs. Brown, whom she found sitting at the head of the stairs when she said Mrs. Brown grabbed her and tried to take her into her room.

WEDDING DEMANDS


