On May 14 a frame building in course of erection on Highland Avenne, Dea-ver, belonging to George B. Mr. Tarr's knee was cut open and the bone exposed for fully three ucches. Mr. McLeod was found senseless and immediately removed to his home. A physician was immedi-ately set for, and upon examination found that he had sustained a tracture of the skull, besides having hif spine badly injured. His recovery is looked
