LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

Sunday Services.—Sunday Schools at 10 a. m. Meeting in the Tabernacle at 2 p. m., and in various ward meeting-houses in the evening as usual. Home missionaries will preach in the latter places.

Thief.—Last night, a red pattern carpet, in two large pieces, the property of Mr. Parsons, residing on Third East Street, was stolen off his parlor floor, where it had been placed for the purpose of airing.

Not One.—Not a solitary jail bird in the city prison. The citizens of Salt Lake should cling together and present His Honor Mayor Little a pair of gloves, as is the custom in some parts of Great Britain when similar events occur.

Priesthood Meeting.—The regular meeting of the Priesthood of the Salt Lake Stake of Zion will be held one week from to-day, Saturday, November 1st, at 11 a. m., in the Fourteenth Ward Assembly Rooms.

Older Home.—Elder Rudger Clawson is on his way home. He telegraphed from Chattanooga, Tenn., that he intended starting for Salt Lake on the night of the 24th inst. (last evening), but would carry a day or two in St. Louis. The murderers of Elder Standing, it will be seen elsewhere, have been acquitted of the charge of riot.

Missionary Work in Tennessee.—Elder Joseph Arns, under date of the 7th inst., writes encouragingly of the work in Hickman County, Tennessee, where he is at present officiating. He and his companions had been preaching there all summer, and expected eight or ten more to join the Church very shortly. They had met some opposition and had been threatened with whippings by evil disposed individuals, who had shown themselves too cowardly, however, to execute their threats. As a rule, though, the Elders were treated with much kindness. The Saints were building a meeting house for the accommodation of traveling Elders. Several families were on the eve of emigrating to Colorado.

The Indian Hoax.—The reported Indian outbreak at Ashley's Fork, has slithered down to a hoax, for which, it is asserted, one Dominick Dignon, the owner of a large cattle ranch near there, is responsible. We do not see how such a move could enhance the value of property, if such were the object in view, nor how a reputation for veracity and common sense could be promoted, by the circulation of such a false and incendiary statement. But we do see how the interests of the community could be subserved, by the arrest and punishment of the trickster as he richly deserves.

Daynes' Benefit.—Prof. Joseph J. Daynes, the popular organist and composer, is to have a grand complimentary benefit in the Twentieth Ward Hall, on Tuesday, October 28th, previous to his departure for New York, to complete his musical education. The performance is dramatic and musical, and will consist of the play of "Kate Wynsey, or Woman's Love" and the comic opera "Trial by Jury." We hope the friends of the benefactor will patronize this performance in full force.

The Asalea Ball.—The Asalea ball, last evening, in the Emporium Hall, was a grand affair, the music furnished by Olsen's excellent quadrille band, being one of the leading attractions. Among the novelties introduced for the first time in the dances here, were the "Pineapple Quadrille" and the "Emporium Varieties," and in every respect the music was finer than any of the kind ever played in our ball rooms. The company was not select, which is the only objection we have heard to the party.

Putting Them on Tight.—The foot-bridge across City Creek, above the old saw mill in the 18th Ward, is undergoing some slight repairs. The bars of the iron bolts that hold the bridge together were being fast removed by mischievous boys, and the structure threatened with early dissipation. The workmen are putting on new bars, and destroying the threads of the bolts, to secure them in their places.

Official Speaks.—One of the latest masterpieces of Utah's judicial polygamy, in its efforts to suppress polygamy, is to employ spies to go around playing little children with questions whose answers would tend to criminate their parents by disclosing the marital relations in which they are living. The idea is as small and contemptible as the soul of the creature who conceived it.

Parted Ammer.—An honest yeoman, on a load of lucern, while turning the southeast corner of the Temple Block this morning with his eyes on something else besides the road he was pursuing, accidentally caught his hind wheel on the massive granite post fixed there, and broke the reach of his wagon in twain. Loss of life merely nominal.

Large Potatoes.—Mr. G. M. White called in this afternoon to exhibit some curious specimens of the White Neehannock potato, grown in his field on Mill Creek. Each potato was made up from ten to a dozen tubers, two of the bunches weighing ten pounds.
