

ANTI-RACE TRACK GAMBLING BILL

Walker-Otis Measure Against Pool Selling Passes Senate.

THE END OF TURF EVENTS.

Sport of Kings Receives Hard Blow In California—Present Season To Continue.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 4.—Racing in the state of California received a vital blow when the senate today, by a vote of 23 to 17, passed the Walker-Otis anti-race track gambling bill, which prohibits pool selling, bookmaking or gambling on horse races. The bill having already passed the assembly, it will now go to the governor for his signature, after which it will become a law. Gov. Gillett has signified his intention to sign the measure if passed by both houses, but he has no doubt that he will not pass this bill until 30 days have elapsed. As the bill permits pool dealers and bookmakers to continue to operate until the present season of racing at the Emerald and Santa Anita courses will be over, it is expected that the bill will be passed before the end of the season.

The Walker-Otis anti-gambling bill in this section, inasmuch as it places the text of the Hughes bill in the state of New York. Violation of the measure is made a felony in the state penitentiary and a heavy fine.

The senate galleries were packed this afternoon when Senator Walker, sponsor of the bill, presented the measure for consideration. He explained that it would prevent horse racing and pool selling, bookmaking and gambling on horse races. He stated that the bill would also prevent the sale of tickets to horse races. As to when he would sign the bill Gov. Gillett was non-committal tonight. Under the law he must sign the bill within 10 days after it is sent to him. He said that he might sign it before the end of the month, but he might take longer. He said that he would sign it if it passed the assembly.
