

## SULTAN AHMED MIRAZA PROCLAIMED

Shah of Persia by the National Assembly in Presence of Immense Crowds in Teheran.

MOHAMED ALI WAS DEPOSED.

Placed Himself Under Russian Protection—New Ruler is Only Twelve Years Old.

Teheran, July 16.—Mohamed Ali, shah of Persia, was dethroned today, and the crown prince, Sultan Ahmed Miraza, was proclaimed shah by the national assembly, composed of the chief mujtahids and the leaders of the nationalist forces, in the presence of an immense crowd in Parliament square. Mohamed Ali has taken refuge in the Russian summer legation at Zorandeh, where he is under the protection of detachments of Cossacks and Sepoys, dispatched to Zorandeh by the British and Russian diplomatic representatives. The new shah is yet in his minority, and Asad Ali Mirza, head of the Kajar family, has been appointed regent. Sipahdar, one of the most active leaders of the movement, has taken office as minister of war and governor of Teheran. Gen. Liakhoff, through whose negotiations with the Nationalists the surrender was effected, was escorted this afternoon by mounted Bakhtiars to the parliament building, that he might remain temporarily in command of the Cossack brigade, provided he obeyed the orders of the war minister. This arrangement was communicated to the British and Russian legations. The shops and private quarters occupied by the shah's soldiers have been plundered and the residence of the manager of the Indo-European Telegraph company has been looted, but no other homes of foreigners were invaded. The townspeople are taking calmly the sudden change in rulers, and the Nationalists are resting after four days of incessant fighting in the streets of a strange town. Russian and British legation guards are stationed at the Russian summer legation, where the shah has sought safety. The Nationalists have declared, however, that they have no intention of taking a step which might cause serious complications. They look upon the shah's action in seeking the protection of foreign legation as tantamount to voluntary abdication. The shah's decision to place himself under Russian protection was by no means sudden. He had received a Russian consent to receive him the day the Nationalists entered Teheran, but made no move until the troops guarding his palace at Baghshah near Teheran, were forced to retreat to Sultanabad. Arrangements already had been made for his reception and he was greeted by the shah's chamberlain and the staff of the legation and conducted to his new residence, over which the British and Russian flags floated. The diplomatic representatives then proceeded into the city to negotiate with the Nationalists with regard to Gen. Liakhoff and the other Russian officers. It was then agreed that the officers should retain their commands and place themselves under the order of the Nationalist leaders. Gen. Liakhoff was received by Sipahdar, and on offering his services was instructed to police the town. He used the Cossacks for this purpose. Sipahdar, who was wounded while taken to the British legation, where there are a number of refugees, including several Russians, the provisional government displays the utmost confidence that the monarchy will remain, but that the new shah will be bound to support and acknowledge the constitution. No decision has been reached as to the disposition of the dethroned monarch, but it is probable that he will be banished and sent out of the country under a Russian escort. The new shah is 12 years of age. He was declared heir apparent at the time his father ascended the throne. Arrangements had been made to send him to England to be educated.

Some of the spaces bought cost a high price, some are bought low. Many of the spaces acquired in city or country may be held more or less permanently. Some are held for shorter periods, and of some the tenure may be only temporary, as in the case of side walls soon vacated again by new buildings. The new spaces are constantly being leased and the aggregate amount of space is kept up or increased.

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## Saws Made of Paper.

If, for instance, a disk of thin cardboard is caused, by a suitable trans- mission, to rotate very rapidly on the lathe the rotatory tension causes the card to behave like sheet metal. As the "Naturwissenschaften" (Wochen-schrift) points out, the cardboard can, in such case, no longer be bent, and if struck with a hammer, gives off a ringing sound. This is, however, only the beginning. If we place on the shaft of an electro motor a disk of good paper, cut into a ring about eight inches in diameter, this paper disk can be made at the highest rotating speed of the motor to saw through cigar-box wood.

At the cutting surface it acquires a fine brown polish. We can fit on the shaft of the rotatory apparatus a drum about which may be passed an annular closed little chain in such a manner that at the highest rotatory speed of which the motor is capable it can be slipped off the drum. The chain will then behave like a cold ring, will cut across the table, and when it strikes a piece of wood it will cut up like a hoop. The active principle on which all these tension phenomena are based is centrifugal force.
