Stanford University, Cal., April 17 .--The typhoid fever epidemic continues o spread among the students of the university campus and the residents of Palo Alto. Up to this morning 32 cases were reported on the campus, and four r five more students were taken down with the fever today. The number of those afflicted with the malady in Palo Alto aggregate about 25. Several of the most periously affected patients have been taken to the hospital in San Fran-

One section of Esina hall, the men's formitory, has been turned into a tem. porary hospital, while the fraternity uses have their sick wards. Dr. L. L Wilbur, health officer of the campus, has traced the source of the trouble to the milk supplies by one of the Alto dairies. This has been closed for some days, and as the period of infecion has almost passed, any further spread of the disease is not expected. But four women students have taken down with the disease, the rest of the cases being among the men.

Delay in Restoring Niu Chwang.

London, April 18 .- The Times correpondent at Pekin telegraphs that the latest official explanation by the Rus-sian legation of the delay in restoring Niu Chwang to China is that it is due to the presence in that part of British and American gunboats and the conse quent uncertainty as to the possible action of these powers after the resti-tution of the port.
