The Democratic judicial convention of the Third district, comprising the counties of Salt Lake, Summit and Wasatch, assembled in the Salt Lake theater this evening, pursuant to the call of the territorial convention.

It was half past eight minutes after the adjournment—10 o'clock—when the delegates got down to business. But after that there was little or none. The theater was filled with spectators of a large and enthusiastic attendance at the rabble-rousing meetings.

Judge Merritt Has Filed the Decision in Full.

Chief Justice Merritt today filed the decision of the Supreme court in full in the case of Sarah E. Anderson, respondent, vs. Charles D. Tyler, deputy registrar, appellant. The decision covers a number of pages of typewritten matter, and was in the hands of the typewriter on the date of the hearing.

At the conclusion of the third race, the regatta committee has no latitude when the conditions described by Lord Dufferin has been decided by the two committees, and therefore the race is to be resolved under the original terms.
