ALL WANT TO PARTICIPATE.

Policemen, Firemen, Various Deputies And Appointces in All Branches May Land an Extra Feather for Nests.

When the new "American" adminstration takes hold of the city's affairs at the beginning of the year, an increase of salacies amounting to \$50,000 a year will be made among firemet and patrolmen and some of the other officials. This was decided upon Satur day at a caucus of the "American' nombers of the city council and the officials, held in Mayor John S. Bransord's office Councilman Black will ntroduce the ordinance in relation to the police department and L. D. Martin the ordinance increasing the sala ries in the fire department. Both Black and Martin retire from the connett on the first of the year and no biame can be attached to the new members for the increase. The ordinance will prob-atily be passed some time in December and will take effect on the first of the year. The sealer of weights and measures, the oil inspector, and the city poundkeeper will also come in for an increase in a separate organance. New onicers will be appointed at the be-sinning of the year to pay positical neuts. The office of sealer of weights and measures and oi; inspector will be combined and the increase will be \$10 a month.

The schedule of increases in the po-lice department will be as follows: Fatroimen, from \$55 to \$100 a month; mounted officers, from \$100 to \$116; ser-gents of police, from \$100 to \$110; de-tectives, from \$105 to \$110; Heutenants, from \$120 to \$125; secretary of the de-partment, from \$75 to \$100; matron, from \$120 to \$50.
