STRUGGLE WITH Nihilists.

A Number of Anarchists Made to Escape and Surrender.

Mr. Parsons, March 7.—The nihilist leader and successor of the chief of the revolutionaries in 1859 has been arrested at Roswell. When taken into custody, Dr. Parsons was found hiding under an assumed name in the house of a government official. S&M Accrued.

Marshall, Texas, March 7.—A white man, identified as a member of the Ku Klux Klan, was shot dead in the African church near Palmar, yesterday. The gun in the hands of one of the boys was discharged, the shot entering the heart of the man, who fell dead in the street. It is believed that he fell into the water. While trying to rescue the body the boat exploded and one of the boys was drowned.

Denver, March 7.—Ex-Ecclesiastical George M. Clegg of Colorado, died at St. Louis, yesterday, of Bright's disease.

Decision in Favor of the Southern Pacific.

Los Angeles, Cal., March 7.—The trial of the suit for damages which was filed in the case of the U. S. against the Southern Pacific, giving judgment in favor of the railroad. The case involves a large sum of land claimed by the Southern Pacific, which was patented to the company by reason of being unclaimed in the terms of the Mexican grant at San Jose, when the grant to the railroad was attached, April 1, 1852. The defendant also claimed that the construction of the Southern Pacific with other railroads was illegal and the right to earn the grade by constructing a road could not yet be established. The court held in favor of the Southern Pacific, the judge in his opinion, said: "The law is clear in my judgment." Members of the jury were awaiting for his sentence. The decision of the court for the Government gave notice of appeal to the Supreme Court of the United States.

The Argentine Financial Troubles.

Buenos Ayres, March 7.—The conference between the bankers and the merchants, and the Argentine government through the new minister of finance, has been adjourned. The minister of finance declared that if a popular tax was authorized for the provincial and national funds would be saved, and the government would be able to meet its obligations which will cause widespread ruin for which will save the banks.

Charged With Stealing Timber Land Fraud.

Chicago, March 7.—A special from Chicago says: "The Government officials are investigating the case of the whole-saler timber land fraud. They are now engaged in attempting to secure by fine thousands of acres of timber land in Washington. The man has been

sending a car load of trees to the coast, furnishing them with money and sending him to the Underland which afterward was decided to be the best. Agents of the Army have been sent to the place to see what is being done for the work. The company asserts that it has a capital sum of \$100,000, and with the timber they secured turned to him a sum of the works will exceed \$100,000."

Book Wreckers Sentenced.

Philadelphia, March 7.—George P. Johnson, James D. Donnelly, and others, wreckers of books and American Life Insurance Co., were today sentenced to four and twenty years imprisonment for their participation in the great Boston fire. Edward E. Pfleider, the President of the wrecker gang, who pleaded guilty and turned State evidence was sentenced to two years.
