The counsel proved that though the clstern was poison-ed, yet the stomach of the deceased, upon analyzation, showed no pois-on, and contended that the poison had been put in the cistern after h r death by au enemy of Leyer. The prosecution proved, by emin-ent medical authority, that the presence of poison in the stomach was not a necessary evidence of the fact. Leyer was sentenced to the penitentiary for life, which made him gloomy and morose. The cor-oner's jury returned a verdict ac-cordingly. To-day, his son, who was under joint indictment, fled, but wrote back confessing the deed and 'exculpating his father. It is considered a most remarkable case
