the Turkish Cabinet and the Programme-Bismarck Expected at Berlin, etc.

BEBLIN, 4 - The Turkish Cabinet s understood to have declared, in regard to the programme submitted to them by the Powers, that they cannot be expected to endorse a programme concerning which such differences exist among the Power themselves.

Bismarck, who intended to remain at Vaizin until November, is upon the difference between the shortly expected at Berlin.
