Nearly every town has at least one club devoted to the consideration of public affairs. Child labor, the coal strike, municipal law and government, the administration of charities, have been intelligently discussed from one end of the country to the other. Women have a clear comprehension of political and social matters, of which a few years ago, the most intellectual of them knew only theoretically.

The Association for Promoting Scientific Research by Women announces a second prize of \$1,000 for the best thesis written by a woman on a scientific subject, embodying new observations and new conclusions based on independent laboratory research in biological, chemical, or physical science. All these must be presented to the executive committee of the association and must be in the hands of Mrs. Helen H. Richards of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Boston before January 1, 1903. The prize will be awarded in April, 1903. The theses for the earlier prize of \$1,000, announced in December, 1900, for research work of a similar character, are due December 31, 1902. The award will be made next April.
