Morrill offered the following as a substitute: That upon the deposit of United States bonds as required by law, any National Banking Association making the same shall be entitled to receive from the Secretary of the Treasury circulating notes of different denominations in blank, registered and countersigned as provided by law as follows: On United States 4 per cent. bonds, deposited prior to July 1st, 1890, an amount equal to 110 per cent. of the par value of such bonds. 
