With Condolence for the Speakership.

Youngstown, Nov. 25.—Under date of November 10th, Congressmen W. D. Warner wrote to Senator Carlile in reference to Congressman Mills' candidacy for the speakership, saying in part that he regretted the creation of Mills' position, and that he had no record, but the fact that "every Democratic member of Congress whom I know to be in favor of integrating tariff legislation has voted for the bill of Mills." It is, however, asserted, says Mr. Warner, that Mills is qualified by temperament to make a dignified and effective presiding officer. Warner told Carlile his opinion of the project. Senator Carlile, in reply, rebukes the assertion, and says he is sure that Mills is selected no one will ever have greater qualifications to command the House than himself. Warner, however, respects the views of political questions. Referring to the "unfortunate disposition in some quarters to subordinate the question of tariff reform to the question of separation of church and state in the harmony and success of the Democratic party," the Senator says: "Open the door to the discussion of religious units, while upon the silver question, and perhaps upon some others, there are wide and honest differences of opinion among the members of our party, and we must be patient and patient deliberation. Why shall we, on the eve of a great national contest, when 'victory' is almost within our grasp, allow such a question to distract us from the work which we are united, and whose strength is fruitless contention, which can be better adjusted after it has been determined what party the people shall be in, than the people shall be permitted to decide."

The first duty of the Democratic party is to change the laws, over which the earnings of the people are to be used, so that they may be available for private purposes, and whoever proposes to postpone the performance of this duty, in order to inaugurate some other measure, is either a traitor to his party or a person of no account, or any other who is not a wise counselor and would not make a safe leader."

Russia and Silver.

London, Nov. 25.—The Times of London article mentions a rumor, said to be authentic, that the Russian government is likely to make large purchases of silver, with the object of establishing a silver standard.

Germany All Right.

Berlin, Nov. 25.—The North German Gazette, the organ of the government, has published a statement of its conclusions on official statistics, says it considers Germany not measured by a dearth of breadstuffs. It adds, however, that the short year has only necessitated a reduction of the consumption of that grain, and the replacing of rye products by the extended use of wheat.

Russia Wants to other Countries.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 25.—It is announced that Mr. Ober has been authorized to go to Moscow to meet with Mr. Willing, that the entente between Russia and France involves nothing that might be construed as a menace to other countries. The aim of the understanding between Russia and France is to maintain peace.

Germany Hardened.

New York, Nov. 25.—Held, Lyons, a young butcher, was brutally murdered in New York last night, and a cleaver, by Michael Slaney. The凶狠的 man had been the best of friends. Slaney called to collect a bill for funeral. Lyons' widow, who was in the room, was seized with a fit of puerile convulsions between the men. She went out for a moment, and when she returned her son staggered into the room, blood streaming from his head. He fell dead, and sinking on the floor, expired, after muttering "Slaney did it." Slaney was arrested soon after and denied having committed the deed.

The Crime of the Third Party.

Toronto, Kan., Nov. 25.—The executive committee of the People's party central committee, at a meeting today, decided to establish permanent political headquarters here, and arrange for the publication of daily newspapers to champion the cause of the third party. The secretary reported that on the last election the party cast 11,000 votes, or 100,000 votes cast, and anticipated the 11,000 additional votes cast with the Allies, with the F. M. R. A., etc., the party secured 20,000 additional votes.

London, Nov. 25.—A dispatch from southeastern Africa says the Manie tribe has captured numerous Portuguese settlements on the northern coast of Mozambique, including the island of Ilha.

Pittsburgh, Nov. 25.—The engine of the Second Avenue traction company at Hazelwood, was burned this morning together with the electric light, \$100,000.

London, Nov. 25.—In a gambling quarrel a Turkish man-of-war captain, varying from Constantinople, was so severely wounded that his life was restored.

Paris, Nov. 25.—Figures have collected money to cover the fine imposed on the arming of Als and the expenses of "vis."

St. Petersburg, Nov. 25.—A circular has been issued to the converts of the various provinces of the empire notifying them to forbid Jews to buy slaves.

General, N. Y., Nov. 25.—A man, his wife and two children were suffocated by fumes from a charcoal stove here today.

Venezuela, Nov. 25.—Herr Knapi von Lichtenau, son-in-law of the Austrian Emperor, has been granted a long leave of absence from his post, which will be extended to 18 months.

London, Nov. 25.—The British bark "Glenesk" from Palms, Moyens, was wrecked near Fern. The captain's wife and six of the crew were drowned.
