Washington, April 17.—"After all, gentlemen, he is the oldest American of all us; so give him a fair show; give him a chance." In these words President Roosevelt spoke of the members of the Tulsa, Okla., Commercial club, who with a brass band and flaming banners called at the White House today and made it known to the president that they favored the removal of restrictions upon the sale of Indian lands in the new state.

PRESIDENT'S SPEECH.

The president's remarks were as follows: "It is a great pleasure to greet you here. I take a peculiar interest in your great state; and it is a great state, and is going to be a much greater state. I endeavor to find out what is really for your interest and then do it. I went over very carefully with your representatives this question of the removal of the restrictions and came to the conclusion that substantial justice would be done to both the Indian and the white man by keeping for the Indian a homestead of 40 acres of good agricultural land and allowing him to alienate the remainder. I do not think it is to his advantage or to yours that there should be large tracts of non-taxable and non-improved land.

BINDURANT WILL SUSTAINED.

Chicago, April 18.—A dispatch to the Record-Herald from Bloomington, Ill., says:

"After a trial lasting two weeks a jury in the Platt county circuit court yesterday brought in a verdict sustaining the will of Thomas E. Bindurant of Monticello, who left over \$500,000 to church institutions.
