

## SENATOR MITCHELL DISAPPOINTS CROWD

Came to Hear Him Testify in His Own Behalf, but He Did Not Take the Stand.

## ONLY ONE WITNESS FOR DEFENSE

Atty. Henry Makes Argument for Government, Making No Personal Attack.

Portland, Or., June 25.—United States Senator Mitchell will not hear testimony for himself, in his struggle for honor and perhaps for liberty, in the land fraud cases, and the long trial has practically come to a close.

The courtroom was crowded to suffocation when the session opened today, all being drawn by the added interest born in the story that today the aged senator would take the stand and, by his own words, attempt to disprove the testimony of his former partner, Judge A. H. Tanner, and of his former private secretary, Harry C. Robertson, and all were disappointed. The defense had been called and the future of the case will go to the jury early in the afternoon.

One witness was examined by the defense, Mr. George A. Ladd of Portland, who testified that he had asked Senator to secure the establishment of the harbor dues several years ago in order that a wharf might be constructed. The senator did not respond and refused all compensation for his efforts.

All of the evidence introduced by Senator Mitchell was presented before going home and, though it was held to be immaterial by the court, was allowed by the prosecution until this morning, when Mr. Henry began to grow restive, as all the court, and the defense gave over further effort and rested its case.

Senator Thornton addressed the court in argument as to the instructions to be given to the jury, when the case was sent in.

He contend that the indictment alleged that money had been paid to the senator by Fred A. Kriss and argued that the proof showed that checks had been given to Tanner, who in turn sent them to Mitchell, thus preventing any knowledge on the part of the defendant as to the source of his dubious paid him by the firm.

The defense claimed a close similarity to the case of Senator Burton of Kansas for taking bribes, and maintained that while the indictment charged the defendant accepted money from Kline, it was Kline, the man that was known was the indirect recipient of money from the bank, and that while the indictment alleged the receipt of checks, this did not occur, as the checks were purchased by the bank and this man's later indirectly received by Mitchell was all that he got, but that that was quoted to sustain this point.

Dkt. Atty. Henry maintained that the indirect receipt of money was all that was contemplated by the statute and any other interpretation was ridiculous.

Cambridge, Mass., June 27.—Joining with his former college mates today in celebrating the twenty-fifth anniversary of the graduation of the class from Harvard, President Roosevelt returned to his alma mater, not as the chief magistrate of the nation, but as a private citizen and a loyal Harvard alumnus.

Although the ancient university of Harvard would have been glad to pay him all the honor due his high office, it was the president's request that he be regarded merely as a member of the class of '80 rather than as the president of the United States.

Nevertheless, students, alumnae and the citizens of Cambridge united in giving him a hearty greeting as he drove through the streets of the university city.

The president's day was a busy one.

Arriving in Boston at 6:45 o'clock this morning, he was driven to the Cambridge residence of the Right Rev. William Lawrence, Episcopal Bishop of Massachusetts, who had been entertained by the bishop's son, the Rev. Samuel Crothers, pastor of the First Parish Unitarian church of Cambridge.

Breakfast was served at the bishop's house, and among those present, in addition to the president and Private Secy. Leech, were the president's son, Kenneth, who came from Groton school, President's daughters W. Elliot of Harvard University, Judge Francis R. Lowell of the United States circuit court, and the Rev. Samuel Crothers, pastor of the First Parish Unitarian church of Cambridge.

During the forenoon President Roosevelt visited the rooms of the Alpha Delta Phi society, the Harvard chapter of the Theta Delta Chi Fraternity.

Mr. Roosevelt, who belonged to the class of 1880, was welcomed by Dr. Edward C. Conant, the distinguished commander of the G. A. R. for Blithedale Junior Chapter. Captain of the national G. A. R. and by other prominent veterans.

He made a speech to the members of the class who belonged to the same student dining club as did the president.

Of the 100 members of the class of '80, 130 have registered at class headquarters, representing nearly every state in the Union.

Returning from the Oakley country club, the president was driven to the Oakley Country club in Watertown, where the class of '80 had an informal reunion and luncheon was served. A photograph of the class was taken, and also a photograph of the members of the class who belonged to the same student dining club as did the president.

In referring to the recent action of Congress providing for the return of the flag of the Confederate soldiers Gen. Lee said:

"I am glad the wound has healed, so that the flags can be returned before those who won the war are laid to rest."
