

ed his days and evenings experimenting in his laboratory. After Mrs. Hull died, said the police, it was reasonable to suppose that the murderer came to his reason. He was alarmed. He poured ice-water on her chest and face to revive her. He was not even then sure she was dead. He tried a surgeon's last resort—the "fire test." The candle that was held to her eyes dripped, and a drop of its grease fell on her sleeve. The ether flamed up, and burned her eyebrows. Nobody but the master of the house would have known where to find the ice-water and cologne, and afterwards the bandages, or would have dared to remain and look for them. The strongest proof that the police considered to be against Dr. Hull was that a candle was found in his room, the composition of which was the same as the drop on the sleeve of the murdered woman. Its end had been burned away on one side as if it might have been tipped up to apply the "fire test." According to the police it was evident that the murderer, ignorant of the fact that burglars bring their own ropes for tying people, used the material at hand and bandaged the woman as surgeons bandage patients when they amputate limbs. He was too skilful to tie "surgeons' knots," but foolish enough to tie any other sort of a knot, whereas a burglar would have tied but one kind of a knot. The police were sure that it took an hour to bind the woman. Who but a doctor would handle a dead body that length of time? It was evident that the murderer, desirous of ventilating the house to drive away the smell of ether, opened the back parlor windows, the sliding doors, the hall doors and the street doors. It was their theory that the husband rifled the trunk and the drawers to deceive the police, not to gain plunder. He knew her fortune would be his when she died.

With the sense of guilt that never failed to betray itself, as interpreted by the police, the doctor said he laid awake from 12 to 2 o'clock in the morning, the very time of the murder. But he said he was restless because it was a very hot night, yet he wore in bed his flannels, his shirt and his stockings. Finally, he met the police at the door in the morning and pretended to know nothing. He could not say what his wife's habits were, what money, stocks or bonds she had; he could not even describe her jewelry. When asked what his age was he said, "50, 60 or 70." Pretending to be feeble and decrepit, he was yet able to run up and down stairs like a vigorous boy, and an officer who saw him seated at the bottom of the stairs was apt to find him at the top of the house a minute later. There was some talk of an attempt to prove that the doctor and Mrs. Hull had some words the night before Mrs. Hull went to bed.

In the absence of any evidence against any other person, this was the theory and the evidence that would almost certainly have placed Dr. Hull upon trial, and might have resulted in sending him to the State prison for the brief remainder of his life, or to the gallows. The police were prepared to show the motive, the opportunity, and the manner of the murder. It is certain that, from Superintendent Walling down, the police believed in this theory, and would have pressed it. The husband had been rich; he was poor. He had been honored; he was put in a second place in his wife's household and among her friends. He was left to potter in his laboratory and to sleep in an attic room, while his wife filled the parlor with her friends and consulted with other men as to the management of her affairs. He was old and decrepit, and his wife's companions were young and gay. Jealousy, wounded pride, cupidity and senile rage—these were sufficient motives for a murder, and all these emotions the police freely attributed to this aged husband, against whose reputation no word had ever been said.

But in the capture and the confession of Chastine Cox, all these suspicions and all this web of carefully woven evidence have disappeared as if they had never been.—N. Y. Sun.

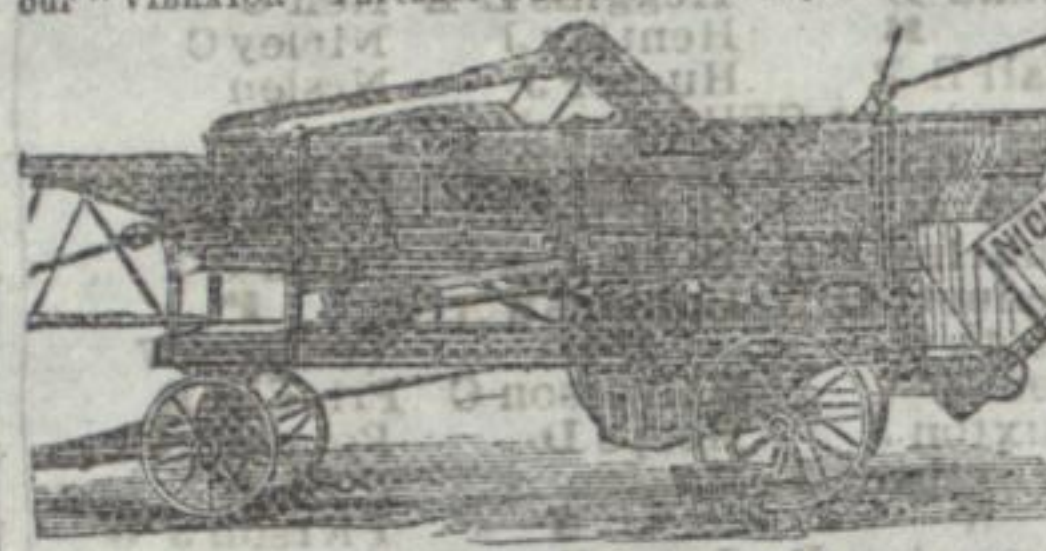
