FORTY-SEVENTH CONGRESS.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 21.—The Vice

President held before the Senate

business resulting from the elec-

tion of officers. By unanimous con-

sent the papers on file in the Sen-

ate relative to the subject have been

referred to the committee on judi-

cary.

Cambridge moved to adjourn to-day

to 9 o'clock.

Cambridge hoped it would be 12 for

the time of unanimity.

Harris replied sarcastically that it

would necessitate a waste of three

hours, and three hours of such work

as the Senate was now doing were

very important.

The motion was lost as also a mo-

tion to go into executive session, 21

to 20.

Cameron of Pennsylvania, moved

that when the Senate adjourned

to-day it be to meet on Monday

next.

Cameron claimed that Daves had

not always been ready to stand

as he now, but had procured an

adjournment last week in order that

he might go to New York.

Daves denied this, and there was

a short colloquy, which delighted

the majority to see the two men

small signs of a split among repub-

licans on the question of the dead-

lock. However, this motion was dis-

puted before the vote was taken.

Cambridge's motion to adjourn

to-day, by Cameron himself

voting against it, in order to show

that the motion was not to be con-

sidered as an abandonment of the re-

publican position. The motion was

lost, 25 to 18.

Cambridge suggested that this might

be a good time to go into executive

session, as there seemed to be a lit-

tle disturbance in the happy family.

Cameron—There is no disturbance.

There never was a disturbance.

A colloquy ensued between Cam-

bridge and Daves on Massachusetts

Call. An article from a Charleston

newspaper was read.

Daves, Hampton admitted that

there had been irregularity and

fraud, but pleaded that it was the

crucial wrong committed on the

people of South Carolina. He would

announce here, as he had done else-

where, his unalterable determina-

tion to try at the earliest possible

moment to rectify this wrong.

Cambridge announced that he had

a telegram from Lieutenant Governor

McClintock as to the charges that

a Massachusetts man, Charles

Heath, had suffered persecution

in Louisiana. Jones said that

he had also a letter from a Mas-

sachusetts man, saying Heath's

reputation for truth is not such as

ought to be defended by the Sen-

ate. He said that the Senate

should not give the name of his

informant for fear he would imperil

his life in Massachusetts. (Laughter.)

In the course of the discussion

Saulsbury endeavored to ask Daves

a question, but was somewhat cur-
