## AN INDIGNANT PROTEST.

Editors Deseret News:

An indignant and injured bar has been driven to open protest and to imperatively demand the removal of the United States Judge in the person of the present Chief Justice of Utah. This self-same obnoxious personage, after a brief absence from the Territory, during which no specific action for his removal has been made public by the authorities at Washington, hastens back and has the audacity, in the face of an almost unanimous impeachment by the Salt Lake Bar, to resume his seat upon the bench.

Is it possible, sir, I wish publicly to ask, that as attorneys we are still to be forced, in the protection of the rights of clients, to attend the persistent call of the docket by an individual who well knows, if he knows anything, that neither client nor attorney has the smallest degree of confidence in his legal ability or in his appreciation of and adherence to true equity, and the high responsibility reposed in a Judge in determining and correcting the mischief between contending parties?

It is possible that litigants, whose causes of difference present interests involving thousands and millions of dollars, shall be impelled to submit them for adjustment to a chancellor who, through acts of palpable weakness and inexcusable incompetency, if not criminal indolence and carelessness, has literally become a stench in the nostrils of every member of the profession (with but a solitary exception or two, and reasons for the

exception being very apparent) and a public hissing and by-word.

Will the department of justice tamely permit this state of affairs to linger, when the life, the liberty, as well as the property, the homes and the future destiny of families, if not of the community itself, are suspended as it were upon a single thread, and that thread the vagary and legal buffoonery of such a judge, when insulted justice, by the unanimous voice of the whole people, demands a justification of the undesignated wrong imposed upon them?

Can a state of depravity so unprecedented in the annals of judicial history—one case only excepted, to wit, that of a certain judicial luminary of Burlington, Iowa, requiring a forced expulsion, like an obstreperous monstrosity, from the habitations of society—be imagined more subversive of law and right?

Does not reason demand that this unwise judge should not only immediately resign the position he has disgraced, but tender that apology due to the Bar and to the public for the defiant resumption of his seat, under such charges, without explanation?

Should not this trampling upon the rights of a civil, wise, and noble community, and flagrant disregard of the solemn protest of a learned and worthy bar, by one man, because his position gives him power to do so, call for such rebuke as shall make of his case a criterion for the future and one of lasting advantage in the material progress and judicial development of this fair Territory?

When I find that the closest examination of decisions precedent, and my advice to clients based thereon are but time and counsel cast away; nay, that these are but the foundation of defeat to them and ruin to myself, does not the common, all-pervading principle of self-defense rise in its irrepressible majesty and protest against the cause and source of perversion?

And finally, allow me to ask, can any honest attorney, true to his client, true to himself, true to his obligation as a conservator of the vital interests of the community to whom he owes his position, do otherwise than protest against the continued incumbency of Michael Schaeffer as Chief Justice of this Territory?

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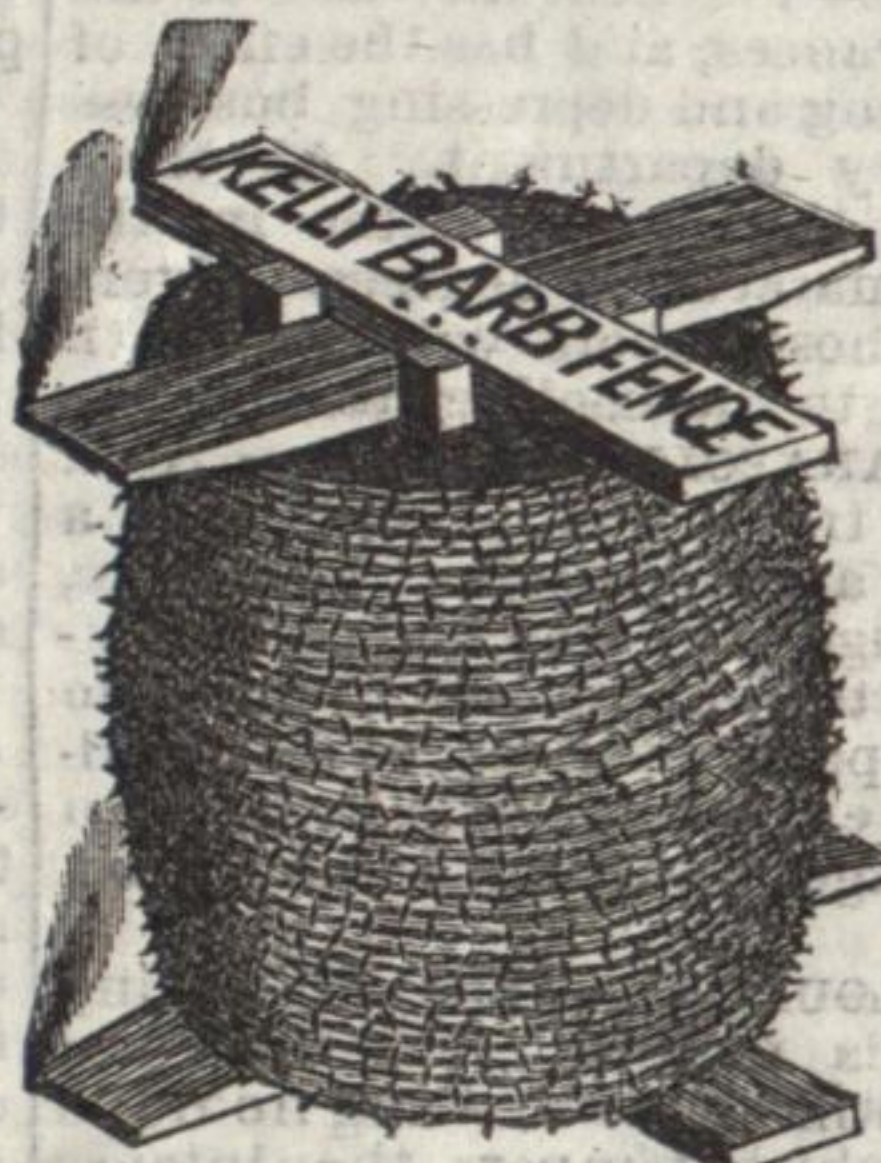
