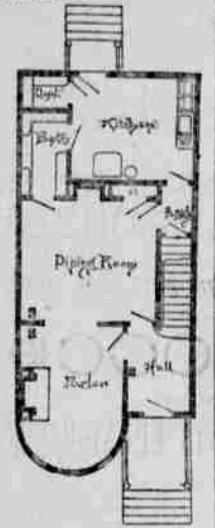


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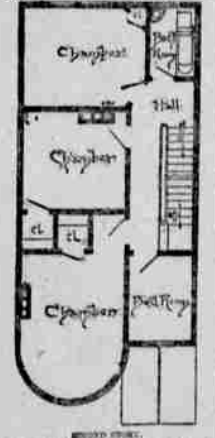
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 The cottage here illustrated was designed and erected to meet the requirements of a small family of moderate means living in a city. It was built upon a lot of 25 feet frontage. The building is 20 feet in width, with a depth of 25 feet. The front is broken by a large square tower and a pretty gabled porch over the main entrance. There are dormer windows in the hip roof, which give to a picturesque appearance and admit light to the rooms in the attic.



RESIDENTIAL.
 In the arrangement of the rooms in this house it will be noticed that the range of the kitchen is placed in the rear of the house, which are reached by a passage.
