


**A \$2,000 DWELLING.**

**20 Rooms, Convenient and of Attractive Appearance.**  
Description of Apartment Dwelling.  
The exterior finish is plain woodwork and suited to those who require the accommodations of a small family of moderate income living in a city. It was built upon a lot of 30 feet frontage. The building is 30 feet in width, with a depth of 40 feet. The front is lighted by a large tower and a pretty glass porch over the entrance. There are dormer windows in the hip roof, which give it a picturesque appearance and admit light to the rooms in the side.



DESCRIPTION.  
In the arrangement of the plan in the front it will be noticed that the main hall extends only to the end of the house, which are furnished by a partition. The rear rooms, however, afford sufficient space to receive large pieces of furniture and the extra room is given to the dining room, increasing the width by about 10 feet. This additional room affords space which will accommodate a large dining room, and various articles desired for this arrangement. The kitchen and fireplaces are placed in the side in the middle, giving absolute space for the preparation of food. The stairs lead from the main hall and a back hall leading to the kitchen and the other stairs, with a short room for the kitchen at the top of the stairs. The plan is separated from the kitchen by a partition, so that there may be a key window in this, and an open fireplace on one side.


