NEWS OF THE DAY.

THE latest item of importance in connection with the Beecher-Tilton abduction, states that the famous Brooklyn preacher has written a letter to Mr. Moulton, adjuring him to tell all he knows in relation to the matter in dispute to the investigating committee.

An explosion in a Pennsylvania powder mill killed several persons.

Three attempts at incendiarism were discovered yesterday at Indianapolis.

In a railway collision at Solihull, Canada, night before last, the trains telescoped, causing a general smash-up and the injury of several persons.

The French Assembly have rejected the motion for dissolution.

The Emperor William will visit Italy this Autumn.

England, Germany and Italy, it is said, have agreed to establish a joint surveillance over the Spanish frontier.

At a meeting, held to-day, the directors of the Bank of England fixed the rate of discount at three per cent.

Cuban news states that a negro captain is enlisting slaves and coolies into the ranks of the insurgents, and that a general rising of the negroes under this leader is anticipated. The plantations are abandoning their plantations for fear of being captured by the insurgents.

A St. John, N. B., dispatch reports the burning of a steam saw mill; loss \$30,000.

The grand jury of Chicago have indicted Nicholas Staden, on a charge of incendiarism; he is to be tried immediately.

A number of Comanche Indians were recently killed on Canadian River, by a company of militia; the Indians had in their possession a number of white scalps.

LOOSE PARDONING.—There has been some rather hasty pardoning done in this Territory, so some people think. In South Carolina this thing is reported to have become notorious, and a judge on the bench protests against such abuse of the pardoning power. At the court of General Sessions in Lancaster Co., in that State, Judge McKay, July 9, passed the following protestatory sentence:

"I do hereby sentence Calvin Black, convicted of arson, to be imprisoned at hard labor in the Penitentiary for life. This convict was ably and earnestly defended by Messrs. Kennard and Moore, two distinguished counsel, assigned by the court.

"The verdict was rendered by an impartial jury of singular intelligence, composed of five white and seven colored citizens, selected by the planter, who had fair challenges. The evidence developed the fact that a child about seven years of age was consumed in the burning dwelling-house.

"I do, therefore, in the name of violated law, protest against executive clemency being extended in this case to the offender, and I hereby withhold the pardoning power as an official law of the State, and convert the State into the symbol of approved crime."

CAPACITY OF THE "LIBERAL."

Those queer local partisans who are so fond of styling themselves "Liberals," are equally fond of boasting that they are greatly given to reform and to public economy, and that they are the unsullied friends of the people in these respects and in everything that conduces to the prosperity, welfare, and happiness of the community.

Upon any one at all acquainted with the course of the more prominent and energetic of these "Liberals," follows such pretensions have very little effect, a smile of derision or a frown of indignation being equally a waste of expression in the connection. With positive incredulity are those pretensions invariably received, as are the divers slanders of honored citizens by the "Liberal" mouthpieces. With all their trickery and misrepresentation, and sweeping together of disaffected, turbulent, mobocratic, lawless elements of society, they actually make out to muster one-tenth of the inhabitants of the Territory. These few persons imagine and proclaim that it is their duty to rule the other nine-tenths, notwithstanding the fundamental principle that all government, general and local, in this republic, rests upon the consent of the people, that is, upon the consent of as many of the people as possible, and especially upon the consent of the fair and clear majority of the people. So far as the people at large have the opportunity to fairly vindicate their wishes, those "Liberals" follow a lead to have the faintest shadow of a chance to occupy the least, the most insignificant, office in the gift of the people. Chicanery, misrepresentation, slander, and prejudice have more or less influence with the federal appointive power, and this is how those corrupt "Liberals" attain to power in this community. They do not stand upon their own individual merits, but upon lies and slanders and prejudice concerning infinitely better citizens than they are.

Those "Liberals" have now the federal offices for the Territory almost wholly in their grasp, and have recently goaded Congress to pass a law materially increasing the number of offices to be correspondingly diminishing the offices in the gift of the people, and still they are unhappy. They covet more, much more. Like the horse-leech, they are continually crying "Give, give." Their lust for power and plunder is insatiable. Such is their rapacity that, though representing, by their own showing, not more than one-tenth of the people, they actually lunge after and endeavor to seize, by hook or by crook, no matter how, all local offices, that they may dip their sticky fingers into the public treasury and spend the taxes which the whole people pay. How those taxes would be spent, if got at by those "Liberals," would be a stinger of a caution to the tax-payers—they would melt away faster than the morning dew before the blazing sun, and the lecher cry would still be, "Give, give!"

Such has been the rapacity of those "Liberals" that they have already procured a provision of U. S. law, represented in its contradictory character, and made applicable nowhere only in this Territory, where those "economical Liberals" propose a provision to pay federal officials out of the local taxes, paid by the people for very different purposes. This is a very apt illustration of the wonderful carelessness with which the "Liberals" mean to handle the local taxes, if they can get their hands into the treasury box. Those "Liberals" are so superlatively economical and liberal that they are anxious, and have procured a law, to take of the \$50,000 local taxes, contributed by the 100,000 citizens of this Territory, to pay the public officers of the United States, which has forty millions of people and a revenue of between \$300,000,000 and \$400,000,000. This is the way these rapacious Liberals would reform and economize in the disbursement of the local taxes.
