

GOLDFIELD BANK AND TRUST CO.

Warrants Out for the Arrest of the President and Cashier and a Promoter.

CHARGED WITH EMBEZZLEMENT

Stockholders' Committee Finds That No Balance Had Been Taken in Bank for Six Weeks.

Goldfield, Nev., May 23.—The report of the committee appointed by the stockholders shows an unfavorable condition of affairs in connection with the Goldfield Bank & Trust company, which was closed yesterday.

Warrants have been issued and are in the hands of Sheriff Bradley for the arrest of J. B. Young, president, and James R. Boal, cashier, charged with embezzlement, and for Francis A. Burton, a promoter, charged with obtaining money under false pretenses. Boal was not arrested in Hawthorne, as reported yesterday.

All day long the streets have been crowded with depositors angry and excited. Mrs. Burton, a confirmed invalid, denies absolutely any connection of her husband with the bank other than as a depositor. Depositors have been heard today who placed approximately \$100 in the bank Saturday, and the examination Monday showed out \$14.05 in checks and lines and a \$5 gold piece.

The stockholders' committee finds that no balance had been taken in the bank for six weeks. On May 18 funds were removed aggregating \$14,000 with a check for \$1,000. The bank's capitalization only \$37,721 had been paid up, of which \$13,283 was invested in the premises, with \$15,000 will come on the gains, and \$5,000 expenses. Francis A. Burton has an open debt of \$1,107, a promissory note for \$1,000, another for \$1,500, a total of \$2,607; then two checks for \$5,500 each on which \$5,000 had been advanced, making Burton personally indebted in the sum of \$12,607. Assets are over-estimated for \$10,000. Bills receivable, \$48,120; real estate, \$13,283.50; cash, \$2,800; missing \$78,247.39. The liabilities are: Due depositors, \$78,602.72; capital stock, \$12,731; due banks, \$10,641; a total of \$107,026.

San Francisco, May 23.—J. B. Young, president of the Goldfield Bank & Trust company, and Francis A. Burton were arrested in this city tonight.

A GOLDFIELD TRAGEDY.

Charles H. Atwood Shot by John Redmond.

Goldfield, Nev., May 23.—Charles H. Atwood of Denver was shot tonight on the main street of Goldfield by John Redmond. The shot entered the right leg, went through and hit the left knee joint, seriously injuring Atwood.

Four men ran out of a saloon fighting, two ran up the street, one turned and fired, hitting Atwood, who was simply a bystander. Redmond was caught with a revolver in his hand. Redmond had intended to shoot Dan McConley of Deaver, with whom he had had an altercation over a farm game.

TWO ENGINES WRECKED.

Los Angeles, May 23.—Two railroad engines were killed and two others severely injured this afternoon by the wrecking of two monster passenger engines on the San Joaquin division of the Southern Pacific, about six miles north of Los Angeles.

The wreck occurred between Laing and Ruge stations, about 15 miles north of Los Angeles. Both engines, which were coupled together and running "light," left the rails at a curve and plunged into the ditch at the side of the track.

KALIEFF HANGED.

He Murdered Grand Duke Sergei in Moscow Feb. 17.

St. Petersburg, May 23.—It is semi-officially announced today that Ivan Kalieff, who murdered Grand Duke Sergei at Moscow Feb. 17, was hanged at 3 o'clock this morning.

On the scaffold Kalieff made a speech in which he said: "I am glad to die. It is a lie. I am faithful to the tradition of the people's will. I do not ask any favors. I am glad to die."

Sunday Ball Playing Illegal.

New York, May 23.—An opinion given by Corporation Counsel Dolaney to Police Commissioner McAdoo today, put an end to Sunday baseball by professional teams in Greater New York.

The corporation counsel finds that Sunday baseball playing by professionals is illegal and that any professionals taking part in such a game should be arrested and tried for violation of the Sunday law.

Automobile Blew Up.

New York, May 23.—A large touring car belonging to Mrs. Howard Gould exploded this afternoon in front of a garage at Thirty-third street and Fifth avenue, through the carelessness of a street sweeper who threw a lighted match under the machine, where there was a quantity of gasoline which had leaked from the tank. The explosion could be heard for blocks and caused excitement among the guests of the Waldorf-Astoria.

Railway Rate Hearing Over.

Washington, May 23.—The senate committee on interstate commerce today closed the hearing on the regulation of railway rates, but will devote the remainder of the week to consideration of a plan of report and other suggestions to facilitate proceedings when Congress assembles.

Samuel Spencer, president of the Southern railway, today made a brief oral statement to be supplemented by another which will be filed with the committee.
