VALUABLE DEVICE.

One Invented to Control Automat-

ically Speed of Automobiles. Washington, Aug. 3.-A device has been invented by which the speed of au-tomobiles may be automatically con-trolled. Report to this effect is made by Vice Consul H. K. Byington of Bris-tol, who describes the device as it has been attached to English machines. This attachment removes the clutch when the speed of the car slightly ex-ceeds the arranged limit. When neces-sary the brake is automaticily applied so that the speed is reduced to just be-low the arranged limit. The brake is the arranged limit. The brake is then quickly but gently removed and the cluth again put in. The apparatus is put in action or out of gear in an instant.
