Many Families Mourning.

A TEXAS TOWN Visited by a Terrible Catastrophe.

The Leon River Overflows Its Banks Crossing Death and Boston.

UVALDE, Tex., Aug. 31.—A terrible catastrophe has hit this thriving town late night, and today there is mourning in many households. The treacherous Leon river, swollen by a raging torrent by recent rains, suddenly without a moment's warning, down upon the town, submerging and wrecking many houses, killing scores of people. In this second sudden disaster by the elements no other town has been inundated. In the excitement of the day it is not definitely known just how many have been buried.

It was about 12 o'clock in the morning when the flood came. The water had been surging and there were ominous clouds to the north and east of the town. The stormers came with a roar, submerging and wrecking many houses. During the night the death toll was as the storm subsided over the city. In the early morning a current of water was discovered flowing down the banks and flooding the low places on either side in a depth of several feet. The east side of the city built on low ground, was directly in the path of the water. All of the houses that were not submerged and in the darkness, as though the dragon of ruin that was faster would be heard the cries of distress from the infested inhabitants, who will effort to save their dear ones.
