LOCAL BRIEFS.

St. Mary's Academy Opens.—St. Mary's academy has opened for the fall term with a larger attendance than ever.

McCaffery Selected.—It. S. McCaffery, metallurgical director at the Tinie smelter, has been appointed professor of metallurgy in the university of Idaho, at Moscow.

Loan to the State.—The state board of land commissioners loaned the state \$50,000 this week to enable the state to tide over the next two months until the taxes are collected.

Jewish New Year.—The Jewish new year, the year 5710, will be celebrated next Wednesday by both local Hebrew congregations with Rosh Hashana services continuing to Friday evening.

Father and Son in Pulpit.—Rev. W. P. Ten Brook of Fairbank, Alaska, and his son, Rev. G. H. Ten Brook, of Merrimac, Penn., alternated in the pulpit of St. Mark's and St. Paul's Episcopal churches yesterday.

Chief Clerk Returns.—Chief Clerk J. F. Thompson of the state board of equalization has returned from a vacation trip to the Pacific coast. The members of the board are looking over the mining camps of the state to find a way to equitable assessment.

Salt Visiting the Lake.—The fact that the resort season has closed has not affected the heavy tourist travel to the lake any. The daily attendance there has been 300 to 400 visitors, one quarter of whom went into the water. Today, however, travel is light. During the Sundays of September and October, trains will run to the lake at 10:30 a. m., 2 and 4:15 p. m.

Checking State Lands.—The state board of land commissioners is checking up 50,000 acres of land for George A. Snow, James A. McElvane and others, known as the Bonneville Irrigation company. The application was originally made by Henry C. Lund, but he assigned it later to the Irrigation company, which is promoting an irrigation system to reclaim the land which is located in Emery County. The project will cost about \$500,000 when it is completed.
