WASHINGTON, 8.—The proposed amendment to the army appropriation bill, concerning the use of troops at the polls for police purposes, which was ruled to be in order to-day, is an exact copy of the clause which was inserted in the army appropriation bill and finally passed last year at the extension session, which obtained the President's approval. All but 19 of the Republican members of the House of Representatives then voted for it, although Edmunds, Hoar and Briggs opposed it.
