

AGUINALDO ISSUES HIS MANIFESTO.

Country Has Declared for Peace—He Acquiesces—Has Been Enough Blood—Accepts American Sway.

Manila, April 19.—Following is Aguinaldo's address to the Filipino people, made public this evening:

"I believe I am not in error in presuming that the unhappy fate to which my adverse fortune has led me is not a surprise to those who have been familiar with the progress of the war. The lessons taught with a full meaning, and which have recently come to my knowledge, suggest with irresistible force that a complete renunciation of hostilities and lasting peace are not only desirable, but absolutely essential to the welfare of the Philippine islands.

"The Philippines have never been disunited at their weakness, nor have they failed in their fortitude and courage. The time has come, however, when they find their advance along this path to be impeded by an irresistible force, which, while it restrains their minds and their yet enlightened sense, presents to them another course, presenting to them the cause of peace.

"This cause has been joyfully accepted by the majority of my fellow-countrymen, who have already united around the glorious sovereign banner of the United States. In this manner they repose their trust and belief that under its protection the Philippines will attain all those liberties which they are beginning to enjoy.

"The country has declared unreservedly in favor of peace. So be it, that there has been enough blood, enough tears and enough desolation. This peace cannot be ignored by the men of arms if they are animated by a desire to serve our noble people, which has thus clearly manifested its will. So I repeat this will, now that it is known to me.

"After mature deliberations, I respectfully proclaim to the voice of a people longing for peace, nor the lamentations of thousands of families yearning to see their dear ones enjoying the liberty and promised generosity of the great American nation.

"By acknowledging and accepting the sovereignty of the United States throughout the Philippine archipelago, as I now do, and without any reservation whatsoever, I believe that I am serving the best interests of my beloved country. May happiness be thine."

To signify this important step in the pacification of the country, Gen. MacArthur orders the release, on the following day, of all the prisoners of war, of 1,000 insurgent prisoners.

THE ADMINISTRATION VIEW.

Washington, April 19.—It is believed by the administration that the manifesto of Aguinaldo will have a decidedly good effect both in the Philippines and in this country. It will take some time for its dissemination among the Filipinos, but it is expected to be of considerable service, and to make more rapid the improvement in the situation which set in some time ago, and which has become much more marked of late.

"HONEST TOM" SAMPSON.

Famous Detective Who Aided in Capture of Mrs. Surratt is Dead.

New York, April 19.—"Honest Tom" Sampson, detective, army veteran and life saver, died last night at Mt. Vernon, N. Y.

Capt. Sampson had sixteen medals for meritorious service, a number of them for saving life, one being awarded to him by Congress. He aided in the arrest of Mrs. Surratt, Miss Fitzpatrick, Edward Payne and Dr. Samuel Cox, who were charged with being implicated in the plot to assassinate President Lincoln.

PORTO RICAN TAXES.

Gov. Allen Wants Those Paid by Island Applied to Island.

San Juan, Porto Rico, April 19.—The correspondent of the Associated Press learns upon good authority that Gov. Allen, now in Washington, will urge President McKinley to construct the Foraker bill, that if the Porto Rican tariff is removed next July as reported, the import duties upon goods from foreign countries into Porto Rico shall be paid to Porto Rico and not to the treasury of the United States, as is present the case with most of the duties collected here from foreign imports. It is argued that local merchants are not benefited if the United States receive the custom receipts.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

At Last a Break Seems to Have Been Made in the Lesson Scheme.

New York, April 19.—A break seems at last to have come in the Sunday school international lesson scheme. Since Tuesday of this week Sunday school experts representing all religious bodies in the United States and Canada, and all lesson experts have been in conference in this city. For many years the demands upon the international committee to change the scheme have been many, but since 1872 the universality of the lessons has been continuous and new about 12,000,000 pupils and teachers study these lessons weekly. The break came recently, when the international committee considered favorably two propositions made by the Sunday School Editorial association as follows:

- 1.—We favor a separate course of lessons for one year, for beginners in Bible study of six years old and under, and we will heartily co-operate with your committee in making a success of such series as you may propose.
- 2.—From our knowledge of the field and the demands of many Bible students we believe that there should be prepared a two-years' course of study at least that should be historical for adult or senior classes. We think the times ripe for such a course, and request your committee to provide the same in such way as will not interfere with the present international plan.

AGED MORMON LEADERS.

A Denver Newspaper Calls Attention to an Interesting Fact.

The ripe old age to which the Presidents of the Mormon Church have lived is a noticeable fact, says the Denver News. Brigham Young died at the age of 76 years. His successor, President Woodruff, lived to be 91 years old. President Snow, who succeeded Woodruff, has just celebrated his 81st birthday. Apostle Cannon, who has just died, was 74 years old. The Mormons have now been fifty-five years in Utah, and many of the pioneers who made the arduous journey across the plains in 1846-47, among them not a few of the Church leaders, still survive, at ages ranging from 75 to 90 years. In stating the fact the News will leave others to account for it. The fact is certainly a remarkable one, and perhaps some pious Mormons will ascribe it to the practice of polygamy. This can well be doubted. The real explanation possibly is that these men were of a sturdy physical nature, which was strengthened and developed by their early life on the plains and in their intermountain territory. Their outdoor life and exercise, their freedom from many of the vices of civilization, the pure air and healthful climate of the Salt Lake valley, the somewhat placid agricultural and pastoral life led in the early days, may all be considered as influences which have had an effect on Mormon existence. Be the causes what they may, the fact is an interesting one and might become an object of interesting inquiry among those who would solve the relations of climate, altitude, religion and social and marital environments to the duration of human life.

VERA GELO ACQUITTED.

She Attempted to Assassinate Prof. Emile Deschanel.

Paris, April 19.—Great interest was taken here in the trial of Vera Gelo, the Russian girl student, who was charged with trying to assassinate Prof. Emile Deschanel, the aged senator and father of the president of the chamber of deputies, on January 19th, by firing a revolver at him just as he concluded a lecture on French literature at the College of France. She was acquitted today.

The interest in the case was heightened by the fact that Zelinne, the Russian girl friend of Vera Gelo, who intervened between the latter and Prof. Deschanel at the time and received a bullet in her chest, died in hospital after lingering some time in agony. Prof. Deschanel frequently visited the wounded girl at the hospital and daily sent her bouquets of flowers up to the time of her death.

A strange feature of the case was Vera Gelo's obstinate silence as to the nature of the outrage she claims was inflicted on her at Geneva by a man she thought was Prof. Deschanel. She suffers from hysteria and medical men believe she is the victim of hallucinations.

ARMY IN THE PHILIPPINES.

Gen. Corbin Says There Will Be No Material Change.

Washington, April 19.—Adj. Gen. Corbin authorizes the statement that no material changes will be made in the army in the Philippines until after the war. The present force of about 10,000 men, Gen. Chaffee on the subject, in accordance with orders previously issued, Gen. Chaffee will relieve Gen. MacArthur of the command of the military forces in the Philippines on June 30th, and the present expectation is that a general civil government will be established in the archipelago about that time.

Gen. Corbin says that recent developments in the Philippines have caused no change in the general plans of the department for the dispatch of regular troops from the United States to replace the volunteers for discharge before July next. Gen. Corbin gives an emphatic denial to the published reports that Gen. MacArthur has been instructed to reduce the army immediately to 40,000 men.

GEN. YAMA ASSASSINATED.

He Was Chief Leader of the Rebel Maya Indians.

Merida, Yucatan, April 19.—Gen. Felipe Yama, the chief leader of the Maya rebel Indians, has been assassinated by some of his own officers who have exasperated at his advice to surrender and end the war. Three minor chiefs attacked him with machetes, nearly cutting him to pieces. Then the Indians gathered in making a large and indulged in a long orgy. This action, it is believed, shows a determination of the chiefs to keep up the Indian fighting, though deserters say food has given out.
