Democratic Special—Plans are being made to run a Democratic special train to Provo Saturday, when a notification meeting will be held for Jesse W. Knight. All state candidates will be present, and the state committee hopes to make it an auspicious campaign opening.

Miss Robinson Recovering—The many friends of Miss Bertha Holman, president of the Girls' Athletic Association of the Salt Lake High school, who have been seriously ill for the past week, will be glad to hear that she is recovering and will soon be back to her old post.

Governor Cutler in San Francisco—Governor Cutler has left for San Francisco, where he will deliver an address at the sessions of the Trans-Mississippi Commercial congress being held in that city during the remainder of the present week. The governor's address will be delivered today.

Sees a Bigger City—L. F. Curtis, a Reno, Nev., mining man, is in town for the first time in 16 years. He expresses himself as being very much advanced in the town in that time. Mr. Curtis is dispatcher for the Rapid Transit company of this city, and is on duty at the Salt Lake City Railroad company.

BOARD DISLIKES OVERTURES MADE

Offers to City Teachers to Go Elsewhere Considered Unfriendly in Resolution.

BIG CONTRACTS ARE LET

Fire Escapes Are to Be Built at High School—New Teachers Added To City Force.

At a meeting of the city board of education held last evening the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, That the board of education will consider it an unfriendly act for any person representing an institution of school system to offer, without approval from the board of education, a teacher under contract any inducement calculated to cause the withdrawal of such teacher from the school system of the city of Salt Lake."

Without naming any educational institution at which the resolution was aimed, it was evidently intended to apply to any who had added to their own teaching corps at the expense of the city schools. It was understood that teachers under contract with the board of education have been approached and offered flattering inducements to become identified with other institutions.

The practice is traceable to heads of departments, who seek to obtain the best possible material in their respective divisions, and in some instances the practice is made with the sole object of offering a friend or acquaintance a better position.

The practice, however, works an injury to the city schools, and the resolution was designed to correct the evil.

CONTRACT AWARDED. The firm of Van der Horst Bros. was awarded the contract to erect the school designed for the Walker street school, at the corner of Main and West Temple streets. The sum of \$71,000 was bid by those contractors, being the lowest bid submitted. The Bamberger Coal company securing the prize. Fuel to the amount of 6,500,000 pounds will be used during the year.

The teachers' corps was increased by the following names: Bessie Jones, Jessie M. Douglas, Margaret J. Minto, Grace Belmont, Elsie De Groot, Nellie Quinn, May Galt, Nora Reese, Viola Kelly, Emma McNeill, Kate James.

Miss Blanche Caine received the appointment as teacher in the domestic science department of the high school, and Miss Lois Miller was transferred to the training school. Features of the report of the committee on buildings and grounds are as follows:

That the clerk be directed to pay taxes on land recently purchased by the board, the board having assumed the taxes.

That the committee be authorized to erect a fire escape ladder and stand pipe at the high school and science building.

That the bid of the Bamberger Coal company to furnish either Rock Springs No. 1 or Castle Gate coal, lump and nut, at \$3.50 per ton, be accepted, and that the president and clerk of the board be authorized to enter into contract for same.

That the action of the committee be approved in renewing boiler insurance on the Onega and high school boilers with the Hartford Boiler Insurance company.

That the action of the committee be approved in renting a room adjacent to the Riverside school at \$15 a month; also, in expending \$200 putting room in condition for occupancy.

MANUAL TRAINING ROOM. That \$350 be appropriated to prepare manual training room in the building recently purchased adjoining the Hamilton school, and moving the building there, and in connection with the same, the recommendation of R. Kietting, architect, be approved in advising that the contract for the erection of the Walker school building be awarded to the Bamberger Coal company, for \$71,000, and the contract for heating and plumbing to the Will Reese Plumbing company, heating, \$3,200; plumbing, \$1,800.

That the committee be authorized to enter into contract with each of the above-named contractors.

That the matter of reinforcement for the school building on the Walker site be referred to the architect, Mr. Kietting, for further investigation and report to the board at its next meeting.
