it is their intention to visit other rela-tives and friends in Philadelphia and other parts of Pennsylvania and in Ohio. Mr. Weller, who is a Bishop of the Mormon Church, was born in Lan-caster county and came to reside in Chester county when quite a boy. He united himselt with the Mormons when a resident of the latter place in 1840. In the following year he moved to Nau-voo, Illingis, and lived there five years, after which he proceeded to the then Indian Territory, and in 1847 Mr. Weller was one of the body of ploneers which located Sait Lake City. Ever since that time he has resided there, perfectly satisfied with the people and with his home and its surroundings. He expressed himself as understood by the Mormon Church, notwith-standing the opposition, persecutions and insults to which they are 'subject-ed, which emit to confirm his con-fident assurance in the substantial foundation of their religious convic-tions and his came up for hearing before Judge Zane, in the Third District Court today.
