High water, usual here the latter part of May, this year was nearer the latter part of June, and consequently the sup-ply in July and August has held out much better than in other years. Besides the late? unusua rains have increased the supply very materially.

All these things given the respec ive consideration they merit, if the decision be that there is water ufficient for permanent and continual increase of ditches, that Inexcase ought to be made, the sup-ply of water furnished for them, and the dependent inhabitants so far convenienced. If it be decided that there is sufficient water for only certain portions of the year, water for that time might be fornished, with the distinct understanding that in lrouthy mouths in the Summer such supply could not be insisted upon, and the giving or withholding of the
