Shocking Fate of Thomas Sandali at Layton, Davis County, Last Night.

WAS FOULY SLAIN IN A STORE

A Reward of Five Hundred Dollars Offered by E. P. Elliott, Manager of the Farmer's Union, Whose Nightwatchman He Was—Davis County Sheriff Upr.
