The Golding Case -- A decision has just been delivered by the Supreme Court of the Territory of Utah in the case of Salt Lake County and Zerubbabel Snow vs. Robert J. Golding, which was a case appealed from the Third District Court. Mr. Golding, as is well known, was As essor 1875. On the 10th of October, 1876, it was found that he was in arrears, on territorial taxes to the amount of \$7,431.17, and upon county taxes in the sum of \$10,992.71. To cover these arrears Mr. Goulding executed a mortgage to Z. Snow for the benefit of the Territory of Utah and Salt Lake County. A suit was commenced in the Third District Court
