# WHAT IS "ARTESIAN."

#### Precise Significance of Term Made Basis of Interesting Discussion.

The significance of the term "arte-sian" is discussed with great care by Mr. Myron L. Fuller of the United States Geological Survey in Water-Supply and Irrigation Paper No. 160. While there is considerable diversity of practise there is nevertheless a gen-tral tendency to give the term one on of practise there is nevertheless a gen-eral tendency to give the term one or the other of two meanings, and about 50 geologists throughout the country have expressed their willingness to accept any definition agreed on by the majority of active workers on underground-water problems. Discussing the original use of the term artesian (as applied to flowing

Discussing the original use of the term artesian (as applied to flowing wells, first observed in the town of Artois, France), the use of the word in recent scientific literature, in Europe, and the present scientific and popular use of the term in this country, Mr. Fuller makes clear that no definite meaning can be assigned to the word artesian in a publication unless a defi-nition is given in the same paper. It is even found that the same writer employs it differently in different pubemploys it differently in different publications.

lications. The predominant scientific usage of the term is for all wells in which the water rises: in other words, for those exhibiting the hydrostatic or artesian principle. In popular practise it is ap-plied( in addition to the uses previous-ly mentioned, to deep wells in general, especially those in rock, and to a cer-tain extent to any drilled well yield. tain extent to any drilled well yield-ing water of good sanitary quality.
