Fork.

EMERY COUNTY.

The recent report of the poisoning of the waters of Dawho Lake, George-town County, South Carolina, by a hall storm proves to be true. A dense mass of black gum trees surround the lake on all sides. It is well known that the leaves of these trees are strongly impregnated with tannic acid. It has also been accertained that the bottom of the lake con-tains a slight deposit of iron. The poisoning of the water, therefore, is thus explained: The hail storm filled the lake with bruised leaves and small branches from the trees, the tannie acid emanating from which mingled with the iron and formed tunnate of iron, causing the water to turn black as ink and bitter as quinne and pois-oning the fish by thousands. One species of the fish inhabiting this lake survived the singular disaster, and that was the mud fish, which buried itself in the mnd at the bottom, and thus escaped the effects of the poison.
